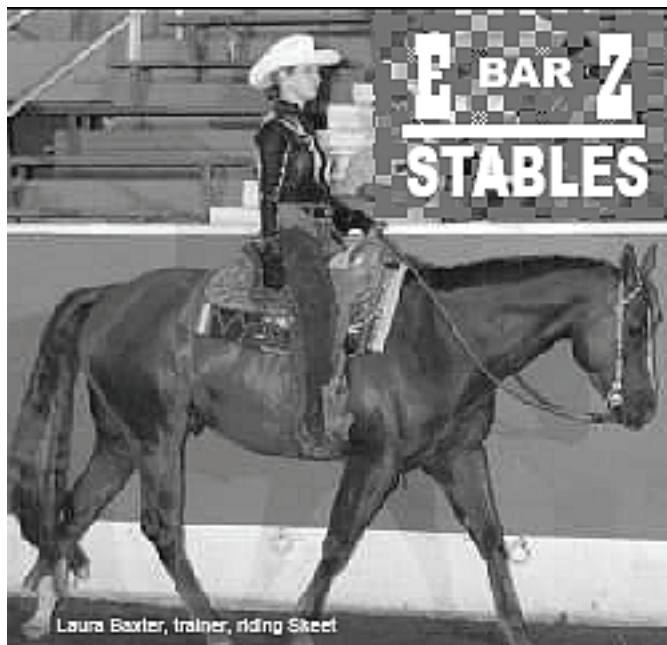

News From The Office

I hope everyone had Happy Holidays, and didn't celebrate too much over New Year's! Plan on 2010 being a great year for KQHA, beginning with the addition of our February show that we will be holding in Oklahoma City, Oklahoma. Plan to attend, as the show will be large, and it will be a Youth Qualifying show. The next show, the School's Almost Out, has moved to Wichita, and Shannon Justice will be managing it this year. I find that with the busy Spring duties in the office, managing the Youth show is no longer feasible for me. I know that Shannon will do a great job on the show.

Speaking of Wichita, the current situation there is that they definitely plan to tear down the large Coliseum building, the Britt Brown. For 2010, they will leave the horse show arenas and will book the usual dates there. 2011 is up in the air at this point. There have been three proposals put forth to the County Commissioners for private groups or individuals to manage the facility. As of last week, two of the commissioners wanted the county to continue managing the facility, two wanted to tear it all down, and the fifth is on the fence. Losing the Coliseum facility would have long lasting repercussions for us all, and would result in shows being further away, in more expensive facilities.

Plan to attend the annual meeting and banquet this year, to be held in Topeka, at the Public Library. We have adopted a new format. Rather than spending two, and in some cases, three, days for the meetings, most members will be able to attend the meetings and participate in the banquet and awards ceremonies in one day. Think of it as "one stop shopping"! The schedule is posted elsewhere in this newsletter, so I won't list it here, but would like to urge all of you to attend. This is your chance to speak up and voice your opinion, and to hear what plans may be in the works for the future. Please plan to attend your individual group's meetings, and also the general meeting. Remem-



Serrault-Gorthy Scholarship Applications Due

The KQHA Serrault-Gorthy scholarship is funded through the KQHA Educational & Research Fund, a licensed charitable entity with the state of Kansas. Donations to the scholarship fund are tax free. The scholarship is named after Bob Serrault the long time 81/40 club president in Salina and Paul Gorthy from Saint Francis, KS. The first winner was Nancy Olson in 1980/1981. This years winners were Sydney Doane and Alex Graber.

In 2007 the fund received a large boost from the bequest from the estate of Robert Young, a Quarter Horse enthusiast from Salina, KS. We receive 1/3 of the yearly income from the estate into the scholarship fund in addition to our previous funds. This bequest has significantly increased the value of the scholarships.

All KQHYA members of at least 3 years including the application year are eligible to apply for the funds. Application is by essay detailing equine accomplishments, academic accomplishments and extracurricular activities. The deadline for seniors to apply for the fall semester is March 15, 2010.

Selection of the award s) is made by an independent committee of retired educators not affiliated with KQHA.

Now comes the exciting part. From the first scholarship award of \$150 in 1979, we are going to award \$7,650 this year. This is due to the generous trust of the Robert Young estate. Money will be available annually from this trust for our Kansas youth. This is just an example of what people can do for future generations of youth with thoughtfulness and foresight.

Our scholarship winners this year are Sidney Doane of Downs, and Alex Graber of McPherson. This scholarship money should make their college education a lot more affordable.

I think back with a touch of sadness when I remember some of the outstanding youth that applied for the scholarship in the past, but because of limited funds, we were not able to award money to all of them. Now, even though financial times are tight, we are going to have some funds that may come down to more recipients, even though it may be smaller amounts than the last three awards. In the last two years we have awarded a total of \$9,798.50.

This is a worthy endeavor and all KQHA youth should seriously consider applying for this scholarship in their senior year of high school. It is worth the effort of the application and I hope everyone will take advantage of this opportunity.
